7.C) Ionization System – Bob Silva was here from Precision Controls to present information about this system. Bob has put this system in Kickapoo Schools, Hillsboro, Viroqua, the courthouse in Richland Center, along with Symons recreation center. Bob has pending proposals at Wauzeka, and Highland Schools. Bob believes that the technology in this system works and it kills germs, binds up dirt, cleans air, and takes out allergens. Bob talked about how the ions work. He believes it is another layer of protection for the staff and students. Knoble asked Bob if he has seen any other test results besides the one controlled study in the packet, Bob said no. Bob can borrow a meter and check to see how many ions are in a certain location to make sure there is airflow in every room. Bob discussed each building the school has and how the system would be set up. Some buildings would not have airflow in the hallways. Bob also mentioned he put a system in his house and he noticed a difference in air quality. Bryce Bird asked if we could move the system if we were to build a new school eventually. Bob said yes, he could take the modules off the old building and reuse them as long as we still have uni-vents and do not switch to a different system. Knoble asked if he was aware of this system in previous years, Bob said no, he had just learned about the system this year. Bob said the technology is ten years old. Kim Trumm asked Bob what other schools are using to pay for the system. Bob said from what he has heard they are using the CARES money to pay for it but he has not been at each board meeting. The system would be \$82,473.00. Bryce mentioned that there is a line item for building projects in the budget for this year, but we also have the CARES money and GEARS money. Bob reminded everyone that the system would continue to benefit the school, removing cold germs, flu germs, and allergens. Bob mentioned the life cycle of the system would be rated at ten years. Discussion about when was the last time the ducts were cleaned in all the buildings. Bob recommends that within the next 5 years we may want to get the ducts cleaned again. The board would like to know if this system would for sure be covered under the CARES money before moving forward.
