

Middle School Student Council

Wisconsin Author Comes To Visit With 6th Grade





The seventh graders review their rules for adding, subtracting, and multiplying integers while playing a game called Integer Golf.


Elementary Staff Gingerbread Houses

The importance of Digital Literacy






If you do not receive an email confirmation, please call him as your email might never have reached him due to being caught in the District email filter.

Boscobel Multimedia Production & Design Class is offering parents/guardians of seniors the opportunity to place a baby picture/message in the yearbook for your graduate. There is **no charge** for this service; we are hoping to get the participation of all parents/guardians. In these messages you may show your love and support by sending a baby picture and a message of approximately **50 words or less** to your child. Any baby pictures and information received will be kept a "secret" from the graduate. If interested, send your baby picture and information to Mr. Chiefari at the high school. The Wisconsin Forward Exam is coming soon.....

When: March 20- April 28, 2023

What is the Wisconsin Forward Exam?

The Wisconsin Forward Exam is designed to gauge how well students are doing in relation to the Wisconsin Academic Standards. These standards outline what students should know and be able to do in order to be college and career ready. The Forward Exam is administered online in the spring of each school year:

Who takes it?

- Grades 3-8 in English language arts (ELA) and mathematics
- Grades 4 and 8 in science
- Grades 4, 8, and 10 in social studies.

What does this mean for my child?

The Forward Exam is a summative assessment that gauges your child’s achievement in the content areas tested compared to other students in the state. Along with local measures such as report cards, school-wide assessments, and other information about your child’s progress in school, the results from the Forward Exam provide insight into how well your child is doing on a broad measure of achievement.

What are the test times for 2022?

The estimated time for test administration in each grade is approximately:

ELA in grades 3-8	130 minutes
Mathematics in Grades 3-5	90 minutes
Mathematics in Grades 6-7	105 minutes
Mathematics in Grade 8	115 minutes
Science in Grades 4 & 8	105 minutes
Social Studies in Grades 4, 8 & 10	70 minutes

**These are estimated times, for the purpose of scheduling, as the Forward Exam is not a timed test.

Assessment News

Juniors



Test date: March 7, 2023

All juniors will be taking the ACT at the high school. There is no registration necessary, this will all be taken care of by the school.

For those interested in doing a retake you can register online for the ACT at www.actstudent.org.

Free ACT Test Preparation Resources:

ACT is now offering a free online test prep. This can be accessed at <https://academy.act.org/>.

- Know exactly what you missed and what you didn't with a score report
- Access related resources to improve your skills based on what you missed
- Retake the test as many times as you want

Students, teachers, and parents can create an account. This account allows students to track their progress and keep moving forward in their test preparation. Short quizzes are designed to help students identify the content they have mastered and to clarify areas where more focus is needed. If students have already taken the ACT or PreACT they can simply enter their scores and custom playlists will be automatically created.

BLOOD PRESSURE SCREENINGS FOR 10TH GRADERS: 10th grade students will have their blood pressures screened mid-winter. Hypertension, or high blood pressure, can be a silent but serious medical concern that is treatable once it is detected. If your child's blood pressure requires additional evaluation, you will receive a referral letter in the mail.

SNACKS:

Boscobel Area Schools is committed to providing a school environment that promotes overall health. We are making efforts to increase exposure and availability of healthy food options for students at school. Engaging students and families in tasting and marketing healthier foods provides a positive impact on nutrition outcomes. Therefore, we are requesting that only healthy snacks be brought to school for sharing. We want to help students make every day a "TRY DAY" ...because trying new foods is exciting and fun. We hope to fuel their days with colorful fruits and veggies!



HEAD LICE:

Head lice is an ongoing problem through the school year. This is a reminder that it is important for parents to be screening their child(ren) for the presence of head lice. To detect the presence of head lice early, we suggest checking your family members' heads on a weekly basis. This is done by parting the hair in small sections with a comb and looking for bite marks, redness, or nits (eggs). The nits are usually found about ¼ to 2 inches from the scalp. They adhere themselves onto the hair shaft and cannot be easily removed. The louse is a small flat, wingless, brownish-gray creature with stubby antennae and six legs each ending in a sharp curved claw. They are most commonly found behind the ears and at the nape of the neck, although they may be found anywhere on the head. The louse can be seen with the naked eye. They range in size and can be very tiny when first hatched. A thorough check for lice should take 15 minutes or more to do and must be done in good light. It is best for everyone to use only their own personal articles at home and school. If evidence of active head lice is found, treatment with anti-lice shampoo is recommended. For more information regarding head lice detection and treatment, contact Grant County Health Department at 723-6416. Another resource for head lice evaluation and treatment is the Lice Clinic of America. You can contact the Dubuque, IA clinic by calling 563-235-1178 or check out their website at <https://www.liceclinicsofamerica.com/landing/Dubuque>. They do charge for their services but can sometimes bill insurances. You can also check with your health care provider, especially since some insurances will pay for specific head lice treatments.

Please note the district's procedure for management of head lice.

1. Students with live head lice, verified by inspection, will be sent home from school for treatment.
2. Repeat cases of live lice will not be readmitted to school. The school nurse will not medically excuse recurring or inadequately treated cases. (The parent/guardian will be responsible for absences related to untreated or inadequately treated cases. These absences could result in truancy.) Students may be rechecked by school staff to rule out continued or recurring infestation.
3. Classroom notification letters will be sent home to alert parents only if a high percentage of children in a classroom are newly infested (no history of head lice).
4. Schools will not perform mass head lice screenings, but will screen on an individual basis by referral. Typically, siblings living in the same household and known close contacts/friends in school will be screened when possible.
